

This book is critical for folks to understand how institutionalized racism in America functions, its origins in Federalism during the creation of the United States, and how such racism continues to create an under-class while, at the same time, furthering "Big" business -- the prison system.

If you want to know what people mean by "systemic racism," read this. Once you understand the

principles, apply them to other systems. They are transferable. Not to take anything away from racism. It is a very special and unique case. But this is a book about the way the world works, and has always worked.

If you've read *The New Jim Crow*, this is the guide you've been waiting for. Practical. Handy. Helpful. Inspiring. It helps us not just see the problem but see how we might be part of the solution, too. It includes tools and guided questions so it's perfect for a book club or action group.
