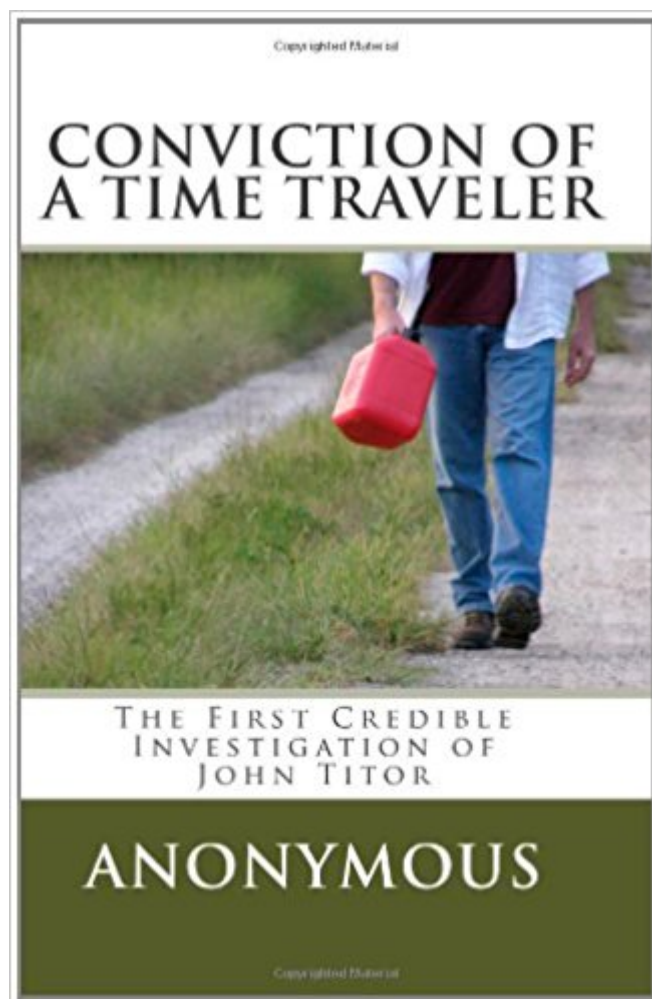


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Conviction Of A Time Traveler

Interesting book that leaves this reader slightly rattled. So many predictions have manifested, yet the main one that disbelievers bring up is the civil war in the USA that is supposed to have happened by now. In my opinion this prediction has also manifested...what else could we call the war between state and civilians that has been ongoing since 911 ? Civil rights have been systematically stripped away, proven false flag events such as Sandy Hook, a war on private gun ownership, and daily reports of cops not acting in the public interest. The prediction of a nuclear war by now has not yet happened, but may do, and the prediction of Russia is certainly unfolding that way now, if a little late. WW3 is still a strong possibility. If we are to believe what other future predictors claim, getting time lines always exactly right is very difficult. This is an excellent investigation piece. The author does a great job of laying out facts and letting the reader decide what to believe. I've known about the John Titor story for a few years and found it to be great entertainment. However the way the author presents and organizes information has made me go from entertainment to hmmm. I highly recommend this book to people who have always regarded the Titor story as just great bit of fiction. It will definitely make you think

First off, the author (whoever he may be) does an impressive effort of proving that the whole John Titor story could actually be real. With fairly intense research, and fairly logical reasoning, the author makes an in-depth explanation as to why the John Titor phenomenon could be true. An interesting read and a worthy one for that alone. I highly recommend anyone interested in the story of John Titor to pick up the book and give it a read as the author does make a compelling case. That being said, the author does tend to argue the point that, while admittedly being well founded, that many who have argued that Titor was a hoax have been fairly close minded and are willing to go on the smallest bit of evidence as proof their entire argument is true. The author claims numerous times the problem with the research done thus far is that the person doing the research has been completely biased towards their argument, and never taking an indifferent unbiased approach to the situation. This particular point is made numerous times but the impact is lessened as the author takes obviously biased opinion towards the argument that it's NOT a hoax. Regardless, the author seems fairly credible for the majority of the book, however his credibility does come into question

when he argues in the later chapters that Barack Obama is NOT American and does NOT deserve to be president. When one falls victim to the ridiculous birther movement and argues for many pages its merits, especially in light of the recently released birth certificate, the reader begins to doubt the 240 odd pages that came before it. Had this section been left out of the book entirely, it would be a far more compelling and interesting read.

My friend kept telling me to read this book, I said "ok screw it I'll check it out, I give up". Wells Time Machine the original and the re-make, Timecop starring Jean Claude Van Damme, Back to the Future with Michael J. Fox, Happy Accidents Starring Marisa Tomei and Vincent D'Onofrio and others over the years and this book is a little bit of a blend of all of them in one way or another. When you read it from the author's perspective/context and how he put it together it's a pretty cool book.
